Historical Capital Spend Year-by-year

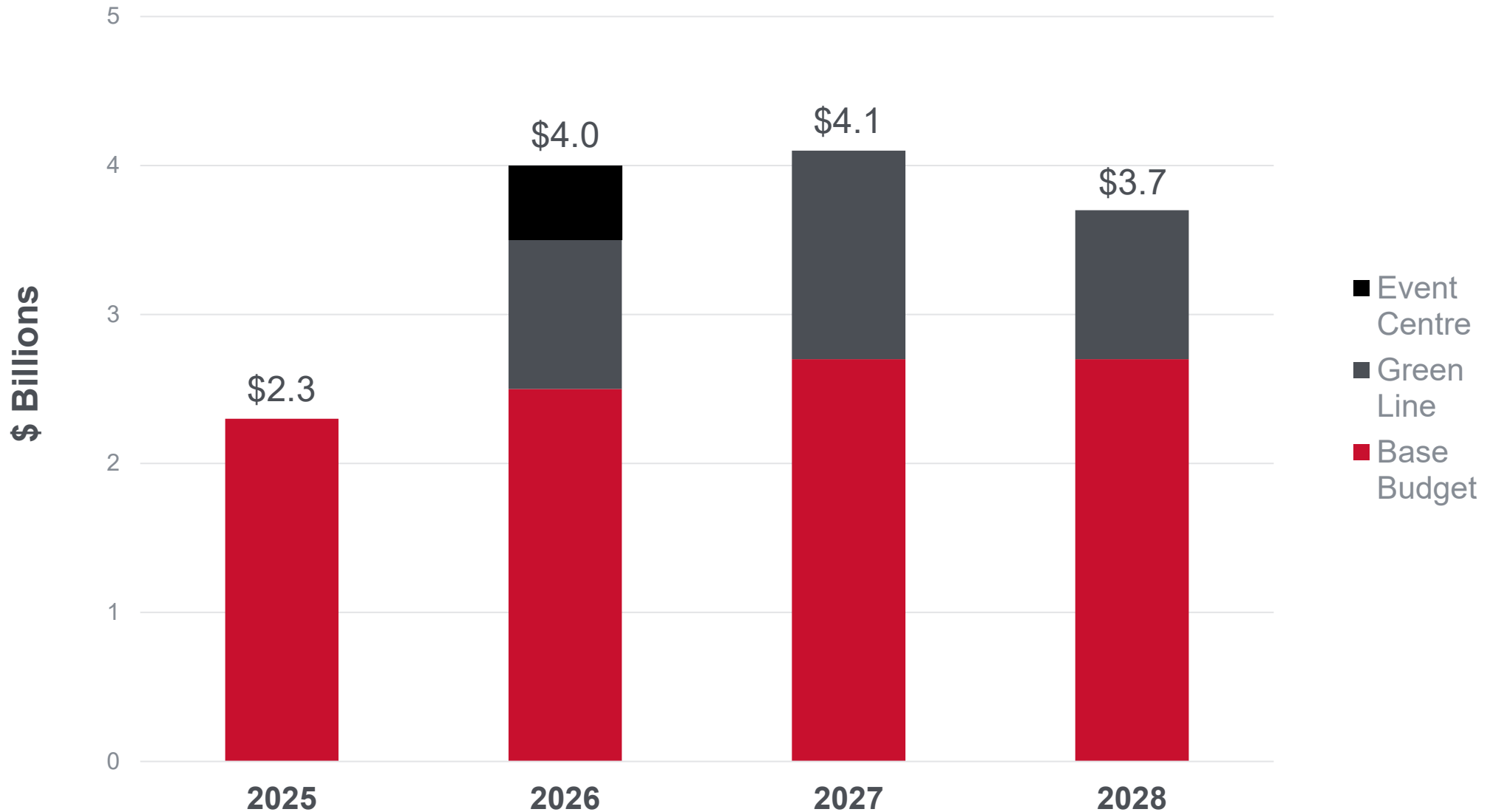
Thanks to improved efficiencies through realigning our organization, we were able to spend over 80% of our budget.



*The *December 2024 Finance Report* has not yet been closed. Anticipated 2024 spend rate is 94%.

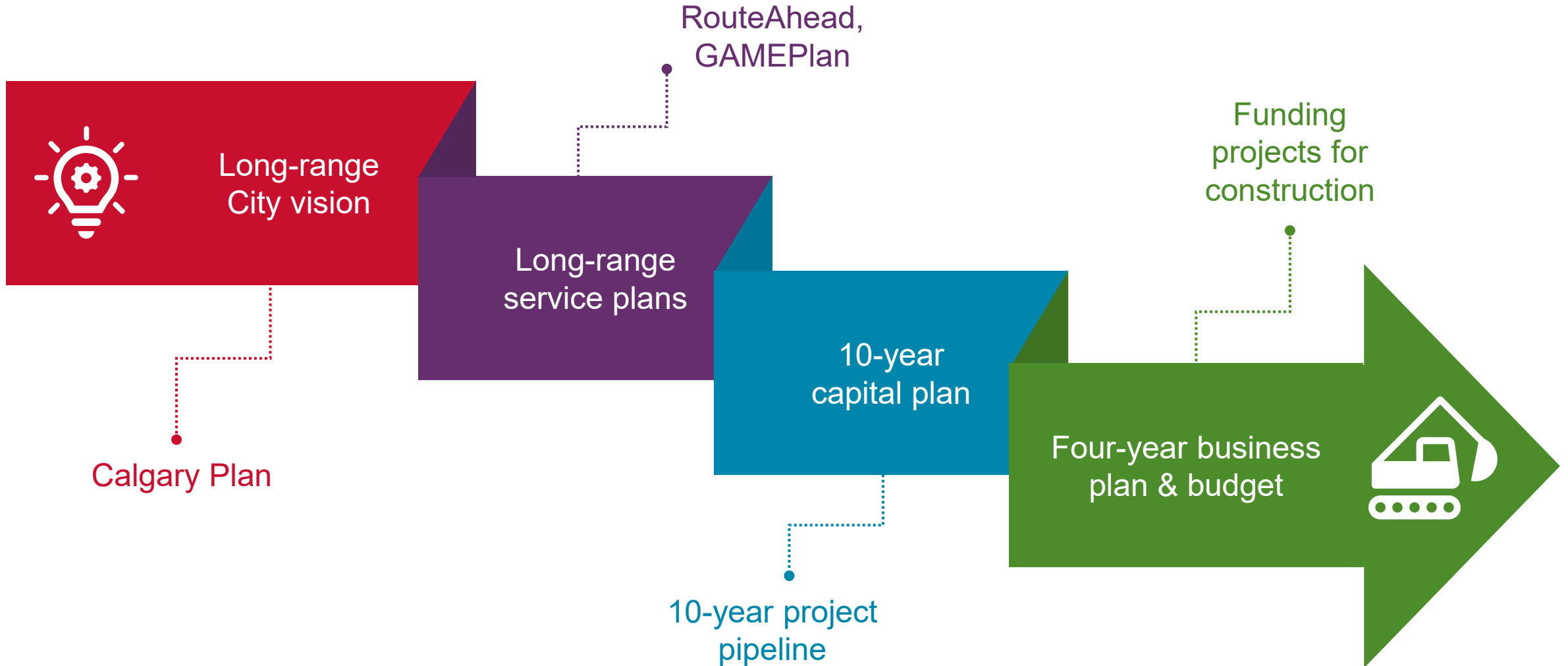


Anticipated Capital Investment Year-by-year



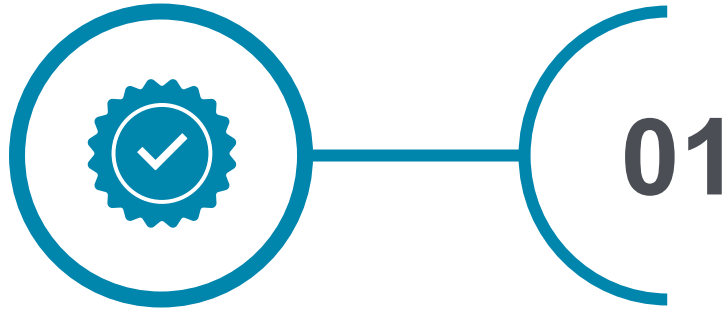
