Residential Rehabilitation

Tender date: 2025 RFP

(1 year term with options to extend for up to three years)

Budget: \$5.0M (for 2025)

• Details: Approximately 7 km of residential and collector streets








Arterial Road Rehabilitation

Contract being extended for 2026 (year 2 of a possible 3-year term)

- Budget: \$7.0M
- Details: Approximately 7 km of arterial streets





Rural Road Rehabilitation

- Extending existing contract for 2025 work
 Year 3 of a possible 3-year term
- Details: ~ 23 km of Class II Rehabilitation (grid roads)







Parking Lots and Trails Rehabilitation

Extending existing contract for 2025 work
 Year 2 of a possible 3-year term

• Budget: \$750,000

• Details: Approximately 11,000m² of parking lot & 2.0km of trail rehabilitation







Annual Sidewalks Missing Links

- Extending existing contract for 2025 work
 Year 2 of a possible 3-year term
- Budget: \$450,000
- Details: Construct new sidewalks in
 - various locations





Gravel Road Rehabilitation

Tender date: Spring 2025

• Budget: \$2.25M

 Details: 10 km of base stabilizing and dust-controlled gravel overlay, intersection rehabilitation, culvert installation and landscape restoration





Bridge Replacements

Tender dates: Q1/Q2

• Budget: \$2M

• Details: 3 Girder bridge and/or bridge-sized culvert replacement





Traffic Signal/ Intersection Replacement

- Tender date: January 9, 2025
- Budget: \$750,000
 - Traffic signal upgrades at two intersections
 - Two traffic signal cabinet replacements
 - Two power distribution cabinet replacements
 - Two uninterrupted power supply upgrades
 - Rapid Flashing Beacon installations at five locations.





Roadway Maintenance

- Aggregate Supply: \$1,000,000 January 2025
- Cold Mix Asphalt, Hot Mix Asphalt, and Soil Cement Supply: \$1,000,000 – January 2025
- Pavement Marking: \$850,000 February 2025
- Hot Pour Crack Sealing: \$500,000 Spring 2025
- Micro Surfacing: \$1,200,000 Spring 2025





Right-of-Way Construction Activity Permit (ROWCAP)

All construction activity within the road Right-Of-Way requires a ROWCAP.

The Pointe Agriculture Event Centre

Site and facility underway, completion in Q3 2025

Fire Station 7 – Planning & design 2024/25 with construction in 2027

Multi-Use Indoor Fieldhouse – Procurement began in 2024. Project is proposed to be completed with IPD delivery process starting construction 2026

Projects not formally approved

Sherwood Park Arena – Upgrades budgeted at \$12 million for 2027

Seniors' Centre – Earmarked at \$10M for 2027/28

- St. Nicholas sport court life cycle (2 tennis courts and a basketball court)

Procurement and Contracts

Procurement Process

RFP Scope Documents

- The department project manager develops the scope, and the Procurement Contract Advisor assembles the RFx package.
- Review all documents thoroughly and ensure submission requirements are met.
 Ask questions during the question period if anything is unclear. No changes can be made once the RFx closes.

Evaluations

 Evaluations are completed in accordance with the evaluation criteria outlined in the RFx. Bids are not compared to each other. It is important for bidders to understand the evaluation criteria, and how each is weighted.

Debriefs

 A debrief offers bidders the chance to receive feedback on their bid and allows the county to gather feedback on their process, enabling improvements for both parties.

Procurement Opportunities

Bonfire - Document viewing, downloading and bid submissions are completed through Bonfire **Alberta Purchasing Connection (APC)** - Notices of all opportunities are posted on APC



Procurement and Contracts

Procurement Process

- **Read the RFx Carefully**: Ensure to thoroughly read the Request for Quote/Proposal (RFx) and understand all requirements and criteria. Ensure all required documentation is submitted, and it aligns with what is asked for.
- **Follow Instructions**: Ensure to follow all instructions precisely, including formatting, submission deadlines, and required documentation.
- **Ask Questions**: Proponents are encouraged to ask questions during the question period if any part of the RFx is unclear. The RFx may be still be changed at this time, but cannot be changed once it closes.
- **Provide Complete Information**: Include all necessary information and documents, such as certifications, references, and detailed responses to all criteria.
- Review and Proofread: Review and proofread bids to avoid errors or omissions.
- Compliance with Terms and Conditions: Ensure to understand and agree to all terms and conditions outlined in the RFP.
- **Highlight Key Points**: Suggest that you highlight how your bid meets or exceeds the requirements and adds value.
- **Submit on Time**: Submit your bid before the deadline to avoid disqualification





Procurement and Contracts

Service Alberta Statutes Amendment Act, 2024 (Bill 30)

- Bill 30 amends the Prompt Payment and Construction Lien Act (PPCLA).
- Amendments allow consulting professionals to opt out of certain PPCLA requirements, including the 10% holdback.
- The County is updating procurement and contract documents to implement these changes once the bill is in force.


